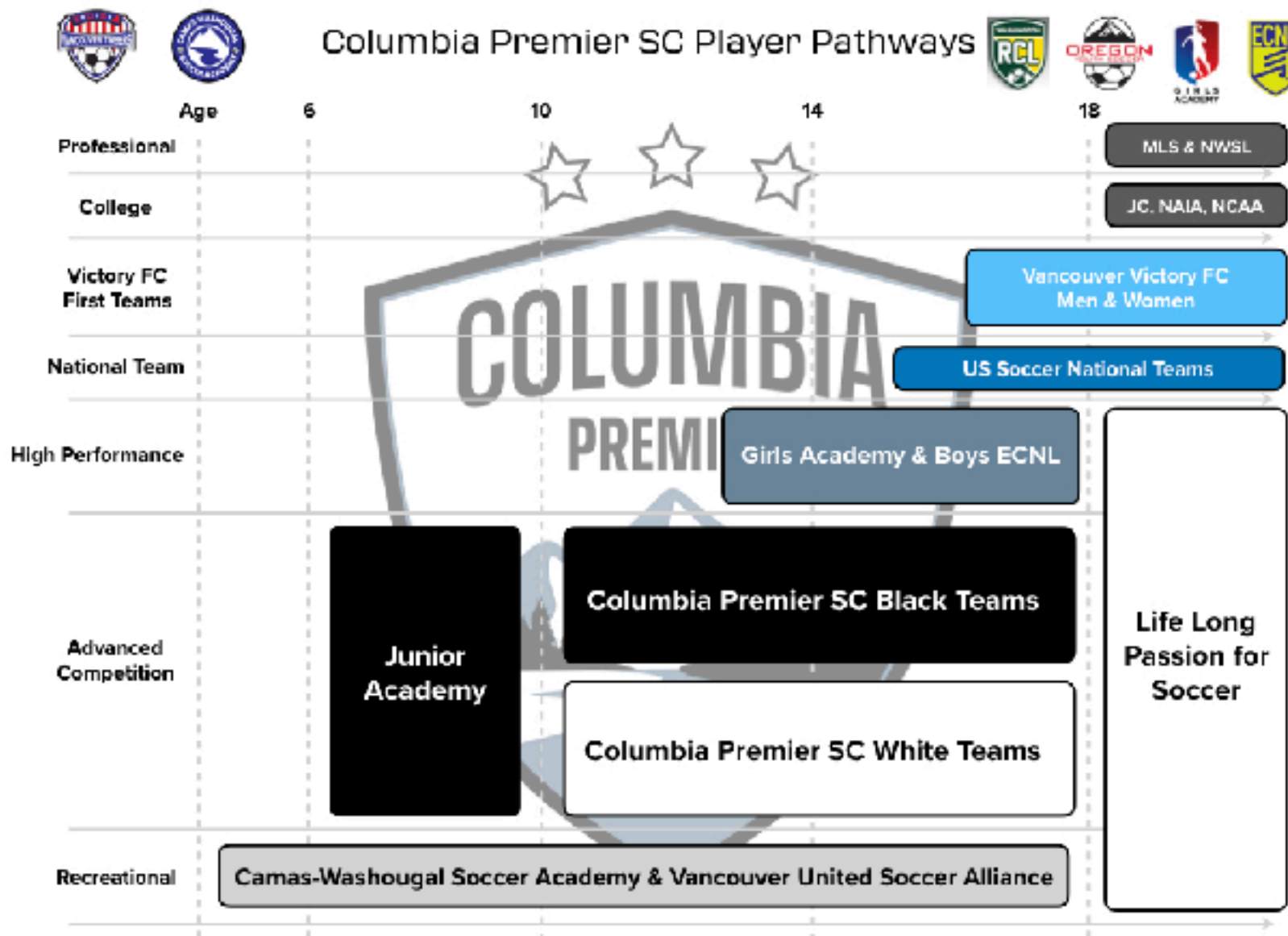
Mission & Vision

CPSC Financial Aid Program

We believe that all players from our community should have access to our programs regardless of ability to pay club fees. We award more than \$100,000 annually in financial aid across our Recreational, Junior Academy, and Academy programs.

We award financial aid to players who demonstrate financial need based on family income. We ask families to provide documentation of state food assistance or other documentation that demonstrates financial need (ie. tax documents) as part of the financial aid application. All information will be kept confidential and only used in determining eligibility for Columbia Premier funds. Coaches and/or Volunteers requesting assistance funds for a family member are given the same consideration as other applicants.

We are very proud to say that we will not turn a prospective player away from our club because of financial need. Please contact us if you need assistance.

Annual Club Fee: \$1,090 plus third party processing fee. Travel and tournament costs are additional.

Training Frequency: 1-2x per week in season

Girls U11-U18/19 & Boys U11-U14 - Oregon Youth Soccer Association Leagues
Boys U15-U18/19 - Washington Youth Soccer Regional Clubs League

Preliminary Tournament Schedule:

- Summer Slam, August 22-24, 2025
- U15-U18/19 - Alliance Showcase, December 2025
- Additional events determined by team and head coach.

End of Season Event: OYSA State Cup/President's Cup or WYS State Cup/President's Cup

Other Sports: Multi-sport participation is encouraged; coaches and families should communicate to develop a plan that helps multi-sport athletes balance participation in all sports during soccer season.



CPSC Academy Programs - 8th Grade

U15 8th Grade Players

Who: U15 age (2011) boys and girls who will be in 8th grade for the 2024-2025 season. U15 age boys and girls who will be freshman in high school but choose not to play high school soccer may also participate.

Annual Club Fee: U15/8th grade programming is included in the respective annual club fees listed above.

Training Frequency: 1-2x per week in season

Girls High School Soccer Season: Fall, September-November, 2025.

Boys High School Soccer Season: Spring, March-May, 2026.

How it works:

- U15/8th grade players will try out with the other U15 players in May 2025 for placement on ability based rosters for the 2025-26 season.
- U15/8th grade players will train and compete on their respective teams throughout the year except during high school season.
- During high school season, we will pool the U15/8th grade players who seek to continue training and play games together, regardless of ability. The U15/8th grade teams will train 1-2x per week and play in an OYSA Division 1-2 league.
